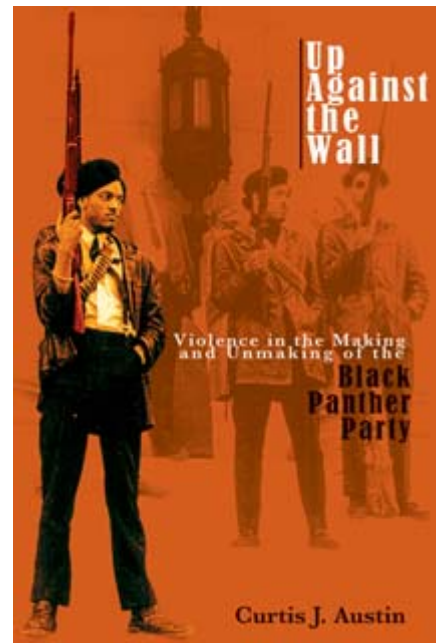
Keynote Speaker
