**University Policy:** A scholarship recipient must be enrolled as a full-time student (Undergraduate – 12 hours; Graduate – 6 hours) during the semester(s) the funds are awarded and be a declared major in the Bryan School. Changing your major to an area outside of the Bryan School will result in cancellation of your scholarship. A scholarship is typically granted for one academic year, for the period of August through May. Scholarships in excess of \$750 will normally be split in half with one-half applied in the fall semester and one-half applied in the spring. Additionally, during the fall semester that your scholarship is applied, you will be provided with your donor's contact information. It is required that you write a thank you note to him/her, and file a copy of this note in the Bryan School Dean's Office. In addition, your attendance at our annual luncheon for scholarship/fellowships recipients and their donors is expected.

## SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

UNCG's Joseph M. Bryan School of Business and Economics offers a number of competitive, merit based scholarships to outstanding students who wish to pursue one of the majors the school offers.

### UNCG Scholars Program

The UNCG Scholars Program (formerly known as Merit Awards) includes prestigious scholarships renewable for up to four years of study. Two of these scholarships are described below.

- Kathleen P. and Joseph M. Bryan Scholarships. The School awards Bryan Scholarships each year that provide the recipients with \$5,000 to \$6,000 per year for four years. These scholarships also include a stipend of up to \$2,500 to support the student's study abroad.
- Bank of America Scholarships. The School awards Bank of America Scholarships each year that provide the recipients with \$5,000 to \$6,000 per year for four years. These scholarships also include a stipend of up to \$2,500 to support the student's study abroad.
- Students who apply through the UNCG Scholars Program are also automatically considered for all other Merit Awards scholarships offered by the University.

Admitted students who are eligible for these scholarships will be invited to apply through [SpartanLink](#). To be eligible for the UNCG Scholars Program, students must have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.5 or higher and test scores of at least 1200 for the SAT (critical reading and math) or at least 27 for the ACT.

The application deadline is January 2, 2012. Finalists are required to participate in on-campus interviews, which are held at the end of February.
