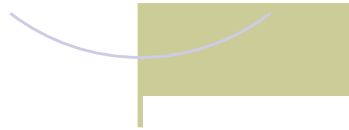

## Bryan Career Services

Greetings from the Bryan Branch Office of Career Services at UNCG! It's never too early to begin preparing for a successful career. Freshman students should begin by exploring fields of interest and learning about resources available on campus like the Career Services Center. Leslie Nguyen is the Bryan School Career Counselor.

The Department of Career Services assists students in researching majors and related careers. As part of the exploration process, counselors recommend services available to assess students' interests, skills, work values, and person-

alities. All of these factors are important to consider as they often affect career decisions following graduation.



Additionally, Career Services helps students create an effective résumé and locate career related part-time and full-time summer employment or internships. Gaining experience and developing transfer-

able skills such as leadership, public speaking, and teamwork will be extremely beneficial as students move through their college careers. This "real world" experience, coupled with a college education, will be essential for your student to obtain an ideal full-time position upon graduation.

## Spring Advising: Coming Soon!

It's hard to believe, but we're already halfway through fall semester. It's time to plan for spring!

Advising for the spring semester begins after fall break. Students will receive a message at their UNCG email account and a postcard in the mail with information on how to

sign up for an advising appointment. During advising, students will meet with advisors to discuss degree requirements, their course plan, and when they can register. After meeting with an advisor, each student will receive an individual advising code which is required for registering for spring classes.

Students can prepare for their advising appointment by printing a new degree evaluation, available through UNCGenie, and preparing a list of potential classes for the spring. Please encourage your student to visit 232 Bryan if s/he has any questions about advising for spring semester.
