**University Information:** Heilbronn University ranks among the major institutions of higher education in the state of Baden-Württemberg. Heilbronn University incorporates a second campus in Künzelsau. This campus specializes in Engineering, Culture, Leisure and Sports Management as well as Media, Product and Customer Management.

**University information:** The University of Mannheim has an impressive profile to offer its students and visitors. At the heart of the university are the faculties of Business and Social Sciences. In these two fields, the University of Mannheim ranks among the best universities in Germany. Today, the university has 13,000 students, including 1800 international students.



**Typical courses students can take:** Most GEC; some business courses taught in English. A free 4-week intensive German course is offered before classes start.

**Good for Majors in:** All Bryan School majors.

**Exchange semesters available:** Academic year (September-July), fall semester (September-December) or spring semester (March-July)

**GPA required or recommended:** 3.0+ for business coursework

**Housing options:** Apartment-style student living.

**Other comments:** “From fishing village to metropolis” could be a simplified summary of the local history of Mannheim. The town owes much of its existence to the castle, in which the university is housed. In the 18<sup>th</sup> century, the city developed itself as one of Europe’s intellectual and cultural centers. Today, the city has recovered much of its glory and is a prosperous industrial town. The city is located on the Rhine River, across from the city Ludwigshafen. The University is located within walking distance from the central train station. Mannheim has excellent public transportation with a street-car system.

**University information:** The Fachhochschule Worms (FH) has a student enrollment of 4,000 students. Foreign students make up approximately 15% of the total student population. Most students study business administration and economics. UNCG students who would like to pursue German language as well as business/economics should consider this program.

**Good for Majors in:** International Business

**Exchange semesters available:** Academic year (October-July) or spring semester (April-July).

**GPA required or recommended:** 3.0+
