

ANNOUNCEMENT OF CLASSICAL STUDIES PROGRAMS FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA

UGA SUMMER GREEK AND LATIN INSTITUTE/SUMMERS-ONLY MA FOR TEACHERS/ LATIN TEACHER SCHOLARSHIPS AND TUITION GRANTS

- The Department of Classics at the University of Georgia offers a program of graduate work in Latin leading to the Master of Arts degree on a summers-only schedule; teachers may enroll in Latin teaching methods and additional coursework in lieu of writing a thesis. Requirements may be completed in four summers, including, if the student elects, one summer semester in Rome. Latin teachers from out of state are awarded tuition waivers reducing fees to the in-state level. Limited scholarship assistance is available and teachers typically qualify for American Classical League, CAMWS, and other scholarship programs. Each summer's curriculum includes undergraduate as well as graduate courses in Latin and Classical Culture, Intensive Beginning Greek (in odd-numbered years), Intensive Beginning Latin (in even-numbered years), Latin teaching methods, and Studies Abroad in Rome. The Summer Session runs from mid-June to early August; some courses are offered in three-week short sessions. The Department houses the office of the American Journal of Archaeology and is adjacent to the University's three-million volume library. The 16-member faculty shares in a tradition of cooperation with high school teachers and programs. All classrooms and most dormitories are air-conditioned. UGA STUDY ABROAD IN ROME

- The University of Georgia announces its Summer Study Abroad Program in Rome. Participants in the Rome Program spend five to six weeks in the city, with numerous field trips and an excursion to Paestum, Pompeii, and the Bay of Naples. Nine semester hours of undergraduate, or six semester hours of graduate, credit may be awarded; some prior background in Classics or ancient studies is preferred. The program runs from mid May to the end of June. All college students with a 3.0 grade average or better are eligible to apply, as are teachers seeking certification credits; deadline for receipt of applications is the first week of December. Teachers may be eligible for American Classical League, CAMWS, and other scholarships; out-of-state Latin teachers pay low in-state tuition. For details write Dr. James C. LATIN VIA DISTANCE EDUCATION

- The University System of Georgia Office of Independent and Distant Learning (IDL) and the University of Georgia Department of Classics offer six undergraduate Latin courses, from elementary (LATN 1001, 1002) through intermediate (LATN 2001, 2002) and advanced courses in Vergil (LATN 3010) and Ovid (LATN 4220), as well as a graduate-level Ovid class (LATN 6220) and a Latin teaching methods class available for either undergraduate or graduate level credit (LATN 4770-6770). Most classes have a pronunciation and discussion component via telephone and are available online. For details visit the IDL site at <http://www.gactr.uga.edu/idl/>. Online registration for undergraduate classes is simple; for the graduate-level courses, prospective students must apply and be admitted (usually in non-degree status) to our UGA Classics graduate program. WARLICK-MANNION SCHOLARSHIP

- The Department of Classics at the University of Georgia invites applications from high-school seniors or college undergraduates for the Warlick-Mannion Scholarship. Established in honor of Charles Louis Warlick and Nora Patricia Mannion, the scholarship is awarded to undergraduates who have studied Latin or classical Greek previously, in high school or college, and who intend to continue their study of classical languages at the University of Georgia. Applicants are expected to provide evidence of excellence in their prior study of Latin or Greek, including teacher recommendations, course grades, and awards for participation in language competitions, and must agree to enroll in at least one Greek or Latin language course at the appropriate level during each semester in which the award is held. The scholarship carries a stipend of up to \$1,000 for the first year and may be renewed annually upon successful re-application.
