### ◆General Education Courses (GEC)◆

To fulfill the degree requirement at the Department of Recreation, Tourism and Hospitality Management, you need to take 36 credits GEC.

They are:

- 1 GLT (Literature)
- 1 GFA ( Fine Arts)
- 1 GPR ( Philosophical/Religious/Ethical Perspectives)
- 1 Additional (either GLT or GFA or GPR)
- 1 GHP ( Historical Perspectives)
- 2 GSB ( Social & Behavioral Sciences), one must be ECO 201
- 2 GNS ( Natural Sciences)from different department prefixes, one must include a lab
- 1 Mathematics: STA 108
- 2 GRD(Reasoning & Discourse)

- ENG 101 / FMS 115 / RCO 101 (choose one )
- CST 105 **Note - some CST 105 sessions are with a (SI) marker, some are with a SI and a WI marker**
- 4 GL or 4 GN(Global Education): must include at least 1 GN (Global Non-Western), Note: HTM 251 is a GL, too.

3. select “ Class Schedule”
4. Term: select the semester
5. Subject : Not Applicable  
Course Category: select GLT or GFA or GPR or GHP or GSB or GNS or GL, or GN

### **Tips for Selecting GEC Courses**

To fulfill the requirement of the degree, you also need to take **2 WI** (writing intensive course) and **2 SI** (speaking intensive course)

- MGT 309 (one of the required courses) is a **WI** and a **SI** course.
- Therefore, you just need to take one more WI and one more SI.

When searching for your GEC courses,

- Find the one you are interested in. (for detailed course descriptions, go to <http://www.uncg.edu/reg/Catalog/current/index.html> )
- See if the GEC courses serve multiple purposes, for example, combine **GLT with a WI and a SI**
- Or take course with a marker of **GFA+ GL** or **GFA+ GN**
