Naturalist Internship Program Description

Overview

The Naturalist Intern assists the Head Naturalist with daily operations in nature programming and at the Activity and Nature Center. Naturalist Interns report directly to the Head Naturalist.

The Interns will plan, organize, implement, and evaluate all daily activities.

Compensation

Naturalist Interns are paid a bi-weekly stipend of \$375. If housing is provided by the resort, a fee will be deducted from each paycheck. As interns are considered seasonal employees, they are ineligible for most employee benefit programs.

Responsibilities and Requirements

To be considered for a Naturalist Intern position, an applicant should meet the following criteria: Be a major in wildlife biology, environmental science, or a related field; be CPR certified with current documentation; possess customer service skills; have a compelling interest in educating others about wildlife sciences and environmental issues; be knowledgeable about proper terminology, principles and techniques of southeastern wildlife and environmental conditions; be able to translate their knowledge of nature hospitably to guests; be able to lift 30-50 pounds; be able to swim; be able to operate a boat; have a valid driver's license; and be able to work in a variety of weather conditions, which may include extreme heat for extended periods of time. This position also requires drug testing per USCG requirements.

The Naturalist Intern's responsibilities will include planning, organizing, implementing, and evaluating the nature programs that are ran through the Activity Center; interpretive pontoon boat cruises; handling and displaying of all animals in the Activity Center; maintaining all animal habitats; performing office duties (should be proficient in Word, Excel, and Publisher); completing and recording sales transaction; assisting with upkeep of department facilities and performing additional duties upon request.

Fripp Island Resort Tennis Internship Description

Overview

The Tennis Intern is responsible for providing service to members and guests. This will include, but is not limited to, court maintenance, Pro Shop duties, teaching private and group lessons (adults and children), racquet stringing, running Round Robin Tournaments, and participating in pro exhibitions. Tennis Interns will report directly to the Head Professional and indirectly to the Director of Tennis. Interns are expected to work 40-50 hours per week and are given one or two days off based on the needs of the department.

Compensation

Tennis interns will be paid a stipend of \$350 bi-weekly and \$15 per hour for teaching lessons. If housing is provided then \$75 is taken out of each paycheck. As interns are considered temporary employees, they are not eligible for most employee benefit programs.

Responsibilities and Requirements

- **Ability to stand and teach lessons for long periods of time**
- **Ability to teach every stroke production to all levels of players**
- **Must be at least a 4.5 NTRP rated player**
- **Make court and lesson reservations**
- **Sell merchandise**
- **Work with POS computer system**
- **Run nightly reports**
- **Set up tennis ball machine**
- **Assist with inventory**
- **Arrange tennis matches**
- **Daily preparation of courts**
- **Perform additional duties upon request**
