My research interests encompass two major focus areas. The first is the psychosocial development of college students. This research area has two major prongs. The first is the development and refinement of a model that describes the psychosocial development of today's college student. The second is the study of factors and interventions that influence student development. I also am broadly interested in today's college students and their issues – access, retention, diversity, psychological distress, etc. Currently, that line of research focuses on the impact of a campus suicide prevention program on the help-seeking attitudes of resident assistants and students.

My second research focus is on graduate students, particularly those in the field of student affairs. Topics of interest include factors that influence students' decisions to pursue a career in student affairs, the preparation of student affairs professionals, and graduate student transition and socialization.
