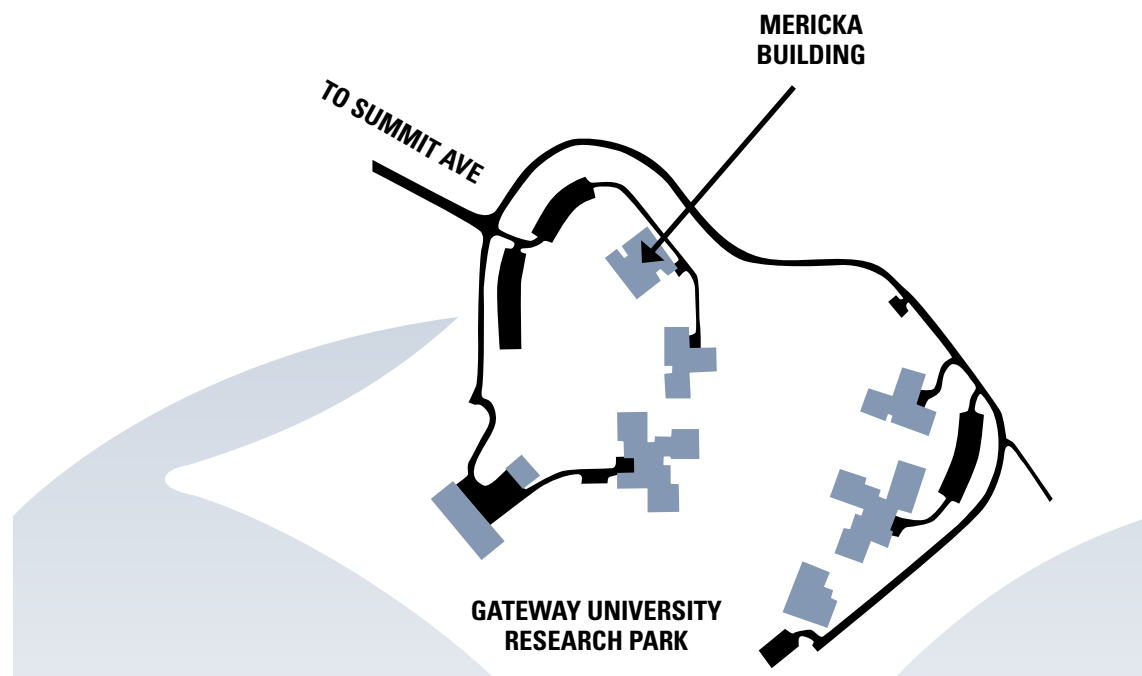
The Speech and Hearing Clinic provides service and support to adults and their families for a variety of communication needs and disabilities.

Our North Carolina licensed and nationally certified clinicians offer individualized attention and support for adults and families in need of speech, language and hearing services. The Speech and Hearing Clinic is dedicated to providing quality services in audiology, speech-language pathology and rehabilitative counseling to adult citizens of the Piedmont and surrounding areas.



## Hearing Services

The hearing clinic offers a full range of services that include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Screening and comprehensive hearing assessment
- Specialized testing for evaluating site of lesion
- Assessment of middle ear function
- Comprehensive program to evaluate, select and fit hearing aids
- Aural rehabilitation services
- Balance disorder management
- Tinnitus management
- Central auditory processing management
- Assistive listening devices
- Hearing screenings for local industries



## Speech-Language Services

The speech-language clinic offers comprehensive services to evaluate and treat adults, using state of the art instrumentation and techniques. Our speech-language pathologists specialize in helping individuals with the following:

- Vocal quality and voice disorders
- Laryngectomy rehabilitation
- Stroke, aphasia and neurogenic language disorders
- Dysarthria, apraxia and motor speech disorders
- Swallowing disorders
- Augmentative communication
- Communication support groups (aphasia, laryngectomy, Parkinson Disease)

- Access to university researchers and specialists

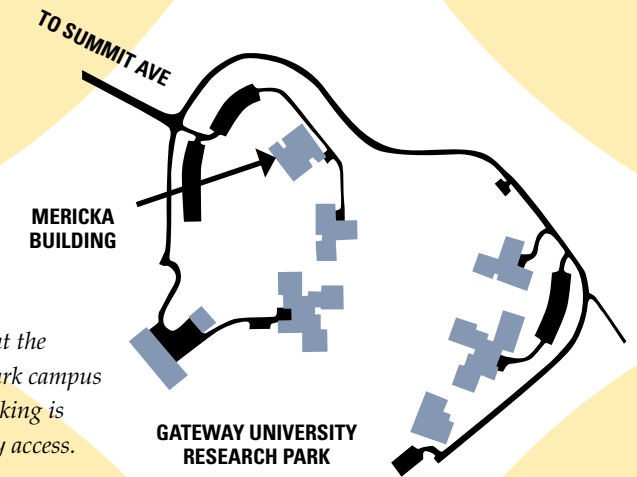

## DIRECTIONS TO GATEWAY UNIVERSITY RESEARCH PARK, 5900 SUMMIT AVENUE, BROWNS SUMMIT, NC 27214

### FROM THE SOUTH

From I-40, take Hwy 29 North to the "Reedy Fork Parkway TO Summit Avenue" exit. Take a LEFT off the exit and take a LEFT onto Summit Avenue (headed back toward Greensboro). About 1/2 mile down on your LEFT will be two brick monuments directly across from Bryan Park Road. Take a LEFT into the facility and follow the drive straight towards the parking lot near the flagpole. Park in this lot and follow the sidewalk next to the flagpole. The Mericka building is the first building on the left.

### FROM THE NORTH

From Hwy 29 Southbound, take the Summit Avenue exit. Off of the exit ramp, turn LEFT onto Summit Avenue. About 1/2 mile down on your LEFT will be two brick monuments directly across from Bryan Park Road. Take a LEFT into the facility and follow the drive straight towards the parking lot near the flagpole. Park in this lot and follow the sidewalk next to the flagpole. The Mericka building is the first building on the left.

### FROM HWY 150

Take Hwy 150 East to Hwy 29 South. From 29 South, take the Summit Avenue exit. Off of the exit ramp, turn left onto Summit Avenue. About 1/2 mile down on your LEFT will be two brick monuments directly across from Bryan Park Road. Take a LEFT into the facility and follow the drive straight towards the parking lot near the flagpole. Park in this lot and follow the sidewalk next to the flagpole. The Mericka building is the first building on the left.

### FROM BATTLEGROUND/PISGAH CHURCH

Turn onto Pisgah Church Road from Battleground. Continue straight on Pisgah Church past the intersections with Elm Street and Church Street. Once you pass Brightwood Elementary on the right, look for Scott Road on the right. Turn RIGHT onto Scott Road and continue straight until Scott ends at Summit Avenue. Turn LEFT onto Summit. The entrance to campus will be approximately 1 mile down Summit on the right. The entrance is directly across the road from Bryan Park Road. Turn RIGHT into the facility and follow the drive straight towards the parking lot near the flagpole. Park in this lot and follow the sidewalk next to the flagpole. The Mericka building is the first building on the left.
