We offer a CIDA-accredited Bachelor of Science degree and a two-year post-professional Master of Science degree. New faculty members will find a deep commitment to intellectual engagement in studio, classroom, and community from the nine fulltime faculty, 200 undergraduate students and 27 graduate students. IARc is one of five departments within Human Environmental Sciences, one of eight schools and colleges at UNCG.

UNCG currently enrolls 18,000 students and employs more than 1000 faculty.
