Dear student,

I am very pleased to inform you that you have been identified as a possible nominee for membership in UNCG's **Eta Delta Chapter of the Phi Beta Delta International Scholars Honor Society**. With 185 chapters established in the US and abroad, [Phi Beta Delta](#) is a resolutely interdisciplinary academic and professional society, unique because it is committed to internationalizing higher education, expanding awareness and understanding of the world in our daily lives, and recognizing students, faculty, staff, and members of our community who demonstrate true achievement in embodying and promoting these goals.

To be considered for membership in UNCG's Eta Delta Chapter of Phi Beta Delta, undergraduate students must meet the following qualifications:

- a minimum **3.5 aggregate GPA**
- at least **50 semester credit hours** earned while enrolled in a degree program at UNCG (to include hours earned while studying abroad)
- **senior-level status** (i.e., at least 90 semester hours overall)
- **significant international experience***

(*Although "significant international experience" typically designates studying abroad in the context of a semester- or year-long opportunity offered through UNCG's International Programs Center [including IPC-approved short-term programs earning a minimum of 6 semester hours of academic credit], this criterion may also denote substantial participation in independent research or creative activity focusing on countries and peoples beyond US borders, international internships, volunteer work with new population groups in our community, etc.)

To complete the nomination process, we are asking you to provide the following materials:

- A completed nomination form (downloadable from the [International and Global Studies Program](#) website) signed by a full-time UNCG faculty member or UNCG administrator familiar with your achievements;
- A curriculum vitae (résumé);
- A copy of your most recent UNCG transcript (downloadable from UNCGenie);
- A one page, type-written (word-processed) reflection statement (addressed to the "PBD Executive Committee") that explains how you qualify for this important recognition. ***It is especially important to address the nature and full extent of your international experience and how it relates to your academic, personal, and/or professional achievements or goals.***

Nomination materials are due in the IGS Program office, Room 103H Foust, Building, by 5:00 pm on Wednesday, March 28, 2012. They may also be scanned and submitted electronically by the same deadline via an email addressed to Ms. Yvonne Matlosz at yimatlos@uncg.edu. Those selected for membership will be notified by no later than April 6 and invited to attend this year's **PBD Induction and Global Leadership Program Graduation Ceremony**, to take place on **Wednesday 11 April 2012, from 5-7 PM, in the Virginia Dare Room**. Nominees will also be asked to pay **one-time new-member dues of \$40** (further details to be provided upon notification of selection.)
