Since earning her doctorate at Princeton University in 1976, Professor Kraemer has established herself as one of the leading authorities on women's religious practice and participation in the Greco-Roman world. Her works include *Her Share of the Blessings: Women's Religions Among Pagans, Jews and Christians in the Greco-Roman World* (Oxford, 1992) and *When Aseneth Met Joseph: A Late Antique Tale of a Biblical Patriarch and His Egyptian Wife, Reconsidered* (Oxford, 1999). *Maenads, Martyrs, Matrons, Monastics: A Sourcebook of Women's Religions in the Greco-Roman World* (Fortress 1988) was a milestone in the study of women in antiquity. Recently she has co-edited *Women and Christian Origins* (Oxford, 1999) with Mary Rose D'Angelo and *Women in Scripture: A Dictionary of Named and Unnamed Women in the Hebrew Bible, The Apocryphal/Deuterocanonical Books and the New Testament* (Houghton-Mifflin 2000) with Carol Meyers and Toni Craven. She has just completed a book on *Star Trek* and religion.
