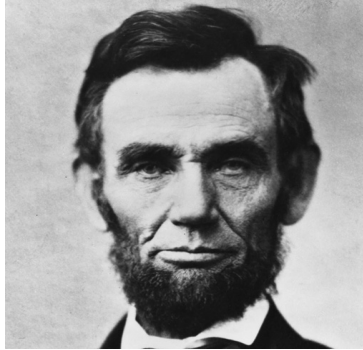

- Allen, Thomas B. *Mr. Lincoln's High-Tech War : How the North Used the Telegraph, Railroads, Surveillance Balloons, Ironclads, High-Powered Weapons, and More to Win the Civil War.* Washington, D.C., National Geographic, 2009. (973.7 ALL)
- Bial, Raymond. *Where Lincoln Walked.* New York: Walker and Co, 1997. Bial's photographs illuminate this unusual biographical portrait of Abraham Lincoln. (B LIN)
- Barden, Cindy. *Abraham Lincoln and His Times.* Mark Twain Media ; Greensboro, NC : Distributed by Carson-Dellosa Pub. Co., 2002. (973 BAR)
- Borden, Louise, and Lewin, Ted. *A. Lincoln and Me.* New York: Scholastic, 2001. A young boy whose birthday falls on February 12th develops an interest in Abraham Lincoln. (E BOR)
- Burleigh, Robert, and Wendell Minor. *Abraham Lincoln Comes Home.* New York: Henry Holt and Co, 2008. After his assassination, President Lincoln's body was transported by train from Washington DC to Springfield IL. Millions gathered along the tracks to honor him. (E BUR)
- Cohn, Amy L., Suzy Schmidt, and David Johnson. *Abraham Lincoln.* New York: Scholastic Press, 2002. This book uses illustrations to convey the story of Abraham Lincoln. (973.7 COH)
- Denenberg, Barry, and Christopher H. Bing. *Lincoln Shot!: A President's Life Remembered.* New York: Feiwel and Friends, 2008. A commemorative edition of "The National News," published one year after Lincoln's death. Included is an engaging, yet detailed account of Lincoln's life. (B LIN)
- Dunn, Joeming W. *Abraham Lincoln.* Edina, Minn: Magic Wagon, 2008. This is a biography of the 16th president in graphic novel format. (741.5 BIO)
- Fitzgerald, Dawn. *Watertown, MA: Charlesbridge, 2007. Vinnie and Abraham.* The true story of Vinnie Ream's courage and persistence in the service of preparing a sculpture of Abraham Lincoln that stands in the Capitol Rotunda. (B REA)

Fleming, Candace. *The Lincolns: A Scrapbook Look at Abraham and Mary*. New York: Schwartz & Wade Books, 2008. Combine well-chosen visuals with blocks of headlined text to portray the life of Lincoln and his wife. (920 FLE)

Freedman, Russell. *Lincoln: A Photobiography*. New York, N.Y.: Clarion Books, 1987. This Newbery Award winner is a comprehensive biography about one of the nation's most fascinating figures. (B LIN)

Fritz, Jean. *Just a few words, Mr. Lincoln : The Story of the Gettysburg Address*. illustrated by Charles Robinson. New York : Grosset & Dunlap, 1993. (973.7 FRI)

Giovanni, Nikki, and Bryan Collier. *Lincoln and Douglass: An American Friendship*. New York: Henry Holt, 2008. This book offers a glimpse into the unusual friendship between two great American leaders. (920 GIO)

Sandler, Martin W. *Lincoln Through the Lens: How Photography Revealed and Shaped an Extraordinary Life*. New York: Walker Pub. Co. 2008. Part history of early photography, part Lincoln biography, and part documentation of the period, this slim book speaks volumes. (973.709 SAN)

Stone, Tanya Lee. *Abraham Lincoln*. DK biography. New York: DK Pub, 2005.
A visually exciting biography of Lincoln published by Dorling Kindersley. (B LIN)

Turner, Ann Warren, and Wendell Minor. *Abe Lincoln Remembers*. New York: HarperCollins, 2001. The focus of this simple picture book is not on Lincoln's death, but rather on the life he led. (B LIN)

Winnick, Karen. *Mr. Lincoln's Whiskers*. Honesdale, Pennsylvania: Boyds Mills Press, 1996. Grace Bedell wrote a letter to soon-to-be President Lincoln in 1860 advising him to grow a beard. She and her family are surprised when Lincoln writes back. (E WIN)

Robinson, Charles, Jean Fritz, and Abraham Lincoln. *Just a Few Words, Mr. Lincoln The Story of the Gettysburg Address*. Westport, CT: Weston Woods, 1999. President Lincoln had two "big jobs": to free the slaves and to win the Civil War. The story focuses on the year 1863 when Lincoln was asked to speak at a ceremony honoring the fallen troops at Gettysburg. (V JUS)
