Funded Research

Co-investigator (with John Rife & Elisabeth Hurd) with the Social Work Educational Loan Program (SWELP), to provide financial support (stipends) for selected seniors during their senior practica. Students had to agree to work in child welfare agencies in pre-selected NC counties. SWELP money was provided through the state. (\$16,000).

Co-investigator (with Robert Wineburg) on a 3-year HUD grant that established a case management unit at the Greensboro Urban Ministry (GUM) to help homeless men and women to become self-sufficient. The case management unit “staffed” by a unit of senior BSW interns doing a block practicum. The social work department was involved in the grant for two years. (\$177,801). Served as field instructor and faculty liaison to students during the first year of the grant.

Co-investigator (with Elisabeth Hurd) on a project funded by the Lois and Samuel Silberman Fund. The one-time grant supported qualitative research that looked at the extent of parent involvement found within a sample population of African American parents and their children.

1990 Principal investigator in a HHS funded grant to conduct a qualitative case study to look at how self-concept is related to alcohol abuse in African American women. The grant was one of three mini grants submitted. (\$39,837)
