The question was raised about using Port 80. There have been increased requests for this option. For Web3 and the Calendar initiative, this is a major stumbling block.

The question was asked about using a proxy.

Calendar

We are continuing to test the Google calendar system. We are trying to determine how to have calendar events automatically update across several calendars. For example, if there is a master calendar, and a user adds a master calendar entry to their personal calendar, any updates to the master calendar doesn't automatically refresh the personal calendar.

One idea would be to set a "time to live"- set an expiration to the appointment and it will go out and grab the appt. again. This would rely on the identifier to the appt is unique.

The public calendar allows RSS Feeds. The private one does not.

There was a lengthy discussion of building our interface with google. The comment was made that if we have to build our own databases to interact with google, then we may be better off building our own calendar system.

Kevin will send a rough draft of recommendations to Web3 for comments/revisions before sending to WOC.
