An audiologist is a healthcare professional specializing in preventing, diagnosing, managing, and treating hearing and balance disorders. They perform hearing tests, fit hearing aids, activate and program cochlear implants, manage tinnitus, and provide treatments for balance issues. Audiologists also implement hearing conservation programs.
