WHO WE ARE

An SLP, sometimes called a speech therapist, helps eligible students who have communication disorders access school curriculum. School SLPs provide treatment for a variety of communication disorders and collaborate with other school professionals like teachers, psychologists, OTs, and PTs



WHAT WE DO

School SLPs work with students in PreK through high school with a number of disorders:

- Speech Disorders
 - fluency (e.g., stuttering)
 - voice
 - speech sound production (e.g., articulation)
- Language Disorders
 - spoken
 - written
 - social
- Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities
